## Curriculum Corner

## ELA

This week in ELA students will be working with fairy tales to review literature elements such as summary, plot, and point of view. In AR students should be at 100\% of their goals by Friday with their comprehension at 85\%.

## Math

Students will be pre-testing over Unit 2 this week. The next unit will be covering Place Value and base ten comparisons. In this module, students extend their work with whole numbers, first with familiar large units (hundreds and thousands), and then develop their understanding up to 1 million. They practice and further deepen their facility with patterns in the base-10 number

## Homework was passed out today, and will be due Thursday.

## Science

This week in science we are starting a new unit about energy called "Energizing Everything." Your child will learn how things need energy to move and that energy can be stored in many different ways. We will see examples of cars powered by gasoline, people, springs and even food! Your child will build a rubber band racer to test how the energy put into the racer impacts how far the racer goes. We will solve the mystery, "Can a car move without gas?"

You might ask, "How does this car have the energy to go? Where did the people get their energy? What other vehicles get their energy from people?"

## Writing:

Practice Note Taking: When you and your child go somewhere like a museum or on a trip, or even when you or child just talks about something interesting or of importance, pretend to be reporters and take notes. Both you and your child can take notes and then use those notes to later describe what you learned. You can even relay your "reports" as a newscaster would on a news show.
